GENERAL RULES

- 4.1 All karts MUST comply with KartSport NZ rules and travel around the circuit in the main direction (anti-clockwise). Reverse direction practice may only be held the day immediately preceding a reverse direction race day. For this day practice will only be in the reverse direction (clockwise).
- 4.2 Every Member competing under the rules of the Club shall be bound by the Regulations, Codes, Rules and Specifications of KartSport New Zealand Incorporated.
- 4.3 The Club shall make rules governing and regulating races for the Club's trophies and championship. These are set out in Schedule Three – Racing Rules.
- 4.4 Mixed age group practice sessions are not permitted. All senior classes can practice together. Juniors must practice separately (aged 12 to 17 yrs). Vortex Mini Rok must practice separately (aged 9 to 13 yrs). Cadet Rok can practice together (aged 6 to 11 yrs). Practice sessions are of 10 minute duration.
- 4.5 Driver must be correctly clothed for practice and racing. Approved crash helmet, driving suit, gloves and footwear, all apparel must be KartSport NZ approved.
- 4.6 The Committee may refuse any race entry that is clearly against the Club's interests.
- 4.7 Club Members and/or other organizations or persons wishing to hire the track, club rooms or any other facilities under the control of the Club for any reason must apply to the Secretary or Administrator or nominated person, who will either approve or decline such application and will advise the appropriate fee, bond and/or conditions of use.
- 4.8 All karts must comply with KartSport NZ noise regulations and have approved air boxes fitted.
- 4.9 Drivers must indicate with a hand signal when pulling off the track. Driving in the pit is not allowed.
- 4.10 Karts can only enter and leave the pits via the correct entry and exit provisions. Entering the pits via the dummy grid is not allowed.

- 4.11 Karts are to be pushed well clear of the circuit if a break down occurs. Karts may not be worked on at track side.
- 4.12 When presenting your Kart and race gear for scrutineering, ensure everything is clean and in race worthy condition.
- 4.13 Motor vehicles are not allowed in the pits and must comply with parking restrictions.
- 4.14 Please ensure your pit space is tidy when vacating. Drivers are responsible for the actions of their pit crew.
- 4.15 Persons not financial with the Club may use the track and pit facilities for testing of karts on officially designated test days provided that such persons are either given express permission by the Committee, are members of a Club affiliated to KartSport New Zealand or are accompanied by a Member of a Club affiliated to KartSport New Zealand and have signed an indemnity form and paid the required fees as set out in Schedule 2.
- 4.16 Members are responsible for any Kartsport Manawatu perpetual trophies presented. They must be returned in good condition to Kartsport Manawatu a minimum of 10 days before the date of the event when the trophy will be presented or when requested in writing by a letter sent from the Secretary. Trophies are not to be engraved. Any engraving will be arranged by Kartsport Manawatu. Trophies for which Kartsport Manawatu are responsible may not be taken out of the country unless an agreed upon bond has been put up and held by Kartsport Manawatu. In the event of a Kartsport Manawatu trophy not being returned by a given time, the recipient will be fined \$200.00 and be responsible for the replacement and updating of a new trophy.
- 4.17 No engine starting before 9am.

Reverse Track Championship

- 3.5 Run at May Club Day.
- 3.6 5 Heat Format run in reverse direction (clockwise). First 4 heats predetermined grid system. 5th heat, lowest points to the front. Driver's worst performance is dropped and the winner is decided over best 4 heats. Is also 1st round of Club Championships.

Club Championships

- 3.9 The 2nd and 3rd rounds of the Club Championship will be held at the July and August club days respectively.
- 3.10 All 3 rounds – i.e. Reverse Track Champs in May and the rounds at the July and August club day will all count towards the points. No rounds are dropped.
- 3.12.1 Each round consists of four predetermined heats and a fifth heat with lowest points to the front. The best four heats determine that days placings with the accumulated points contributing to the series position.

- 3.12.2 At the completion of the series, all counting points from the three rounds are added together to determine the overall winner, the winner being the driver with the least number of accumulate points. Second place goes to next lowest points and so on until all places filled. In the event of a tie, then the count back system is used based on places (1st, 2nd, etc.) and not points. In the event that the tie continues then the placing will go to the driver that first got the lowest tied place (e.g. if the lowest tied place between two drivers was 3rd place, then the driver that got his/her 3rd place first wins the position).

Note: Points for DQ at engine tech – number of confirmed entries plus 5 points times 4 heats

Champion of Champions – No. of laps 12 for Junior, 15 for Senior.

- 3.17 Run in conjunction with the Club Championships as an additional race (Grand Prix) for Juniors and an additional race (Open Grand Prix) for Senior classes.
- 3.18 All three rounds count for the championship. Maximum points are the number of drivers in the race plus one.

Manawatu Club Day: Second Sunday Every Month

Hawkes Bay Club Day: Fourth Sunday Every Month

Taranaki Club Day: Last Sunday Every Month

Wellington Club Day: Third Sunday Every Month
